# Stakeholder Update

## *News and information from the Manchester Arena Inquiry for the week ahead*

This week we will continue to hear evidence related to Chapter 10 - the emergency service response to the attack on 22nd May 2017. All of the witnesses to be called this week are North West Ambulance Service (NWAS) personnel who attended as first responders and some may be called again to give further evidence about their role on the night.

On Monday we will hear from Lea Vaughan, an NWAS Hazardous Area Response Team (HART) Paramedic and Ian Devine NWAS HART Paramedic. On Tuesday we will hear from NWAS Senior Paramedic Joanne Hedges, who was one of the first paramedics on scene and Simon Butler, NWAS Student Paramedic.

We begin Wednesday with NWAS Paramedic Helen Mottram and Gary McMullen, Emergency Technician (EMT 1) with NWAS. Then on Thursday we will hear from Edward Tunn, Associate Medical Director for NWAS and Ronald Schanck a HART Paramedic team leader, who also attended on the night.
