Stakeholder Update

News and information from the Manchester Arena Inquiry for the week ahead

This week, the Manchester Arena Inquiry plans to sit from Monday 19th to Friday 23rd July with hearings commencing at 9.30am, save for Thursday which will start at 10am.

On Monday we will hear evidence from Sarah-Jane Wilson, Head of North West Fire Control. Ms Wilson's evidence may go part heard overnight to Tuesday, when we will hear from NWFC Control Room Operator Rochelle Fallon. On Tuesday we will also hear evidence from Greater Manchester Police firearms officers PC Troy Tyldesley and PC James Dalton, who were on duty on the night of 22nd May 2017 and deployed to the Arena following the attack. On Wednesday, we will hear the conclusion of evidence from former GMP Chief Constable Ian Hopkins and Ian Parry, former director of Emergency Training UK (ETUK).

On Thursday, we will hear evidence from survivors Martin Hibbert, Claire Booth and Bradley Hurley, marking the conclusion of Chapter 9. On Friday, we will conclude the week's evidence with Assistant Chief Constable Sean O'Callaghan from British Transport Police. ACC O'Callaghan previously gave evidence to the Inquiry, and this week his evidence will focus on BTP's response on the night and the changes made since the attack.

The Inquiry will adjourn on 23rd July. Hearings will resume on 6th September.
